**KEEPING THE FIELD LEVEL by Steve Wong**

The Richmond Hotshots host two pistol matches and a special match each month. These matches are considered the best in Northern California, and a great deal of time and energy are put forth to ensure their success.

The pistol matches are USPSA approved which means the rules in the "Practical Shooting Handbook 7th Edition 1995" are followed. A stage description (Course of Fire) is posted at every stage, and all competitors are given a walk-through for every non-surprise stage.

Unfortunately not every stage is being shot per USPSA rules. Here are a few examples: Drop turners that disappear during walk-through, don't disappear during a course of fire; door props that aren't closed when the stage description requires they be closed; and swingers that don't swing due to obvious prop failure.

Rules state the shooter must reshoot the stage when there is a prop failure, however, we're finding competitors are keeping their "unfair" scores and throwing the results off balance. We're not playing on a level field. We need more consistency in our matches!

Following are some possible solutions:

• Have ROs assigned at every stage. The RO would be required to fully understand the stage description they're assigned to. Note: We've been drawing from the same pool of people for assistance with the matches, and this may cause early burn-out.

• Have MD's assign a squad leader for all squads. The squad leader would be required to fully understand the stage description for all stages.

To execute these solutions, the CRO's stage intent must match the stage description. Following is a way to accomplish this:

• After the CRO has finished writing the stage description to match the stage intent/design, the stage description should be read word for word during both safety and competitor walk-through. This would help catch inconsistencies with the write-up and intent/design.

• As a competitor, please read and understand the stage description, listen to the CRO during the walk-through, and feel free to ask questions. We are here to help.

A great amount of time and effort is put forth setting up a match, and when we don't shoot according to the stage description, it's very frustrating for the folks who have put forth that effort and for shooters who have shot according to the rules. Please shoot the stage per the CRO's stage description and abide by the rules of the USPSA.

We are open to any suggestions you may have. Shoot safe and have fun!

**June 1998 Limited Match Director's Report**

The Richmond Hotshot's June Limited Match saw 38 hooters come out and try their hand at a classifier and 4 challenging courses of fire. Considering the Area 1 Championship was being held the same weekend in Reno and it was Father's Day, this was a very good turn out.

I would like to thank our C.R.O.s that came out the Saturday before the match and spent the afternoon setting up the stages to make this match possible.

Thanks to Ron Gunar (stage 1), Kevin Weller (stage 2), Tim Shaver (stage 3), and Scott Miller (stage 4). I would also like to thank Joe Solano for doing all the stats, Dan Haro for doing the sign ups, and Louis Cambre and my son Jason for helping set things up on Saturday.

Finding people to help set up stages and run the computer seems to be getting tougher all the time. Have YOU set up a stage lately? Come on out and build a stage, an active membership helps keep OUR club strong.

**STAGE 1: RESCUE ME:** Ben Derrama won this stage where the shooter started by pulling a rope that opened a port and engaging 3 paper targets, then proceeding through a doorway, "rescuing a baby", 3 moving targets and finishing with 4 upper A/B targets through a low port. Wayne Leong and Brian Agron finished 2nd. and 3rd.

**STAGE 2: THIS STAGE SUCKS:** Ben Derrama won his long running stage that started with some long shots through a phone booth, then heading into a couple of doorways engaging paper and steel along the way to some serious hosing at the end. Rod Maeda and Tim Shaver finished 2nd. and 3rd.

**STAGE 3: MY EX-WIFE REVISITED:** Ben also won his stage of "shoot em when you see em", as long as you were in box A, B or C. Rod Maeda and Louis Cambre came in 2nd. and 3rd.

**STAGE 4: PICK UR ANGLE:** Rod Maeda won this stage, starting with five U.S. poppers at 30 yards from behind a barricade, then steel to the right and left, then to some hosing at the end through high and low ports. Rod picked up enough points over Ben on this stage to pull out the Match Winner's Trophy. Ben and Tim Shaver came in 2nd. and 3rd.

**STAGE 5: SPEED-E-STANDARDS:** Kevin Weller decided to change his strategy at this match and "tube all the stages", but smoke the classifier. Myself and Scott Miller came in 2nd. and 3rd.

**YOU MAKE DA CALL**

At the July Limited Match two different questions regarding a classifier stage occurred. I put the question to the IPSC internet list. The first section is my query to the list; the second in typical of the answers received.

The stage required 3 strings (free style, strong hand, weak hand) of four shots (one each on four different targets).

Shooter #1 (a new shooter and unclassified) fired the first string strong hand only instead of freestyle. I allowed him to fire the second string free style since he didn't clearly understand the procedure. Anyone have a problem with this?

Shooter #2 (an experienced high C class shooter) missed his 1st shot free style (at far left target which presented only upper A/B zone). As RO I noticed that his first shot was a miss as he fired it during the string. Upon scoring the targets I found 4 shots in the 3rd target from the left (a heavily taped target) and decided that a piece of tape had blown off and didn't assess an "extra hit" penalty. Does the RO have the latitude under that situation?

**Reply from the list:**

RE: #1 As someone else pointed out, as long as the shots are of the same level of difficulty on both strings then I see no reason to handle the situation differently than how you did. I the second string, for example, was shot from a closer distance then I would make the shooter shoot it strong hand only and consider the first string his free style string.

RE: #2 Ivan has said that you must score what you see. But disagree. There are times (especially in cold weather) where pasters will not stick well to the targets. Most of the times the shooter will get the two best hits per target but that's not really right. Technically the shooter should be made to reshoot for "range equipment failure" (pasters not sticking). I was an RC on a course of fire once where I heard one shooter say to his buddy to just blow by a target real fast and the muzzle blast will blow off the pasters. We were having trouble with just this one target on the stage. So, right before the first shooter got to the line I announced that I was going to change the target after every shooter because pasters were blowing off from the muzzle blast. The shooter in questions was a bit disappointed. Back to your question. If you are certain that the shooter engaged the target with the correct # of shots and pasters DID fall off then the shooter must reshoot the stage as the equipment failed in such a way as to make a correct score impossible. (How do you know which paster fell off). Most of the time (local informal club matches, giving the best "X" hit) would be a more expedient way to move the squad along and avoid a reshoot).

All in all I'd say you made good calls.

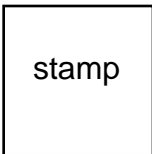
