Well sports fans Dave & Tom Enterprises put on it's first 5 gun specialty match and it was a blast. In addition to the usual 3-guns we added an accuracy rifle event at 200 yards (with bonuses for hitting a 3" dot) and a Smith & Wesson snubbie. All stages except the accuracy rifle were multi gun. My personal favorite was a Dr. Gunar design on range 1.5 which started with a rifle firing at 3 golf balls, 5 playing cards, and 4 IPSC targets. After grounding the rifle safely the shooter proceeded to a table which had a S & W J frame .38 (5 shooter) staged. From that table there were a minimum of 12 shots required. That meant at least two non speed loader reloads. Several of our better shooters tubed this stage big time, but the real reason that I liked it so much is that after nearly 20 years of playing this game, I finally won a stage. I guess all that time playing with my snubbie really paid off this time. I've stopped publishing stage results due to space constraints, but am making an exception for this stage. See results on page 6.

### **3 May 1998 Championship Match Report**

The first thing I'd like to do is recognize some Hotshots for their continued contributions to the club and for helping me out. Stage CRO's for the match were Rudi Waldinger on stage 1, the tireless Ebert Kan on stage 2, the chiropractors best friend Louis Cambre on Stage 3, and half of the Smyth tag team champions, Gene Smyth for Stage 4. These aren't the only people who we all need to thank. Dave Uchida beat down the remaining limited contingent on this one too.

Stage 4, The Umpire Strikes Back, was almost all steel. Your gun had better have been sighted in and your timing on. Russ knocked down all the steel faster than anyone else followed by James O. again then B shooter Jimmy Ventura. Dave Uchida narrowly beat out Gary Ashgavai to win limited rights yet again. The Classifier was boring. Russ won. End of story.

The Overall results placed Russ Wakida as overall winner of the match followed by James Ochoa and then Steve Wong. First Lady for the Match was Sheryl Cruz who on any given day can make most of us guys look really bad.
