## OCTOBER OPEN REPORT

October's Championship match brought out 52 shooters to test their skills. It was a beautiful day to shoot, and we had a lot of shooting to do. 177 rounds all in total, if you didn't take any extra shots.

Ron Gunar was responsible for stage 1 and I don't want to hear any crying. If you were there, just imagine shooting the left side barricade on the left side through a crack about 5-6 inches and the right side barricade on the right side with a crack the same size. He also want the possibility to shoot from a platform but because of possible safety issues, both were scraped. For open class Frank Cruz Jr. took the stage with Rod Maeda and Carl Schmidt following close behind. For Limited John Daudet beat all others by 23%. Ben Derrama and Gene Shuey were 2nd and 3rd.

Stage 2 was JoJo Solono's creation. You started in a chair with your empty gun and your magazine in a briefcase to start. When the buzzer started you shot at a target in front of you, then went left or right or right then left to engage some targets through openings in the walls to either side of you. Then ran forward and right to engage more targets and a swinger with 2 targets on it and still more targets to the right. For open Ray Wakida won the stage with Adam Carlson and Rick Theilen (Mr. inconstant) on his heels. For Limited John Daudet did it again with Rudolf Waldinger and Wayne Leong close behind.

Stage 3 was put on by Jonathan Leong. He was out there at 7 a.m. cleaning up the stage and putting up his stage. He couldn't shoot the match but came anyway to fulfill his promise of putting on a stage. His stage was 46 rounds and that's after he cut down a few rounds. James Ochoa took 1st place honors on this one with Frank Cruz Jr. and Adam Carlson right on his tail. For Limited Jon Daudet won by just squeaking by Wayne Leong and Ben Derrama.

Stage 4 was designed by Rod Maeda and had quite a bit of running and shooting. Starting out by opening a door and engaging two target on the way to a barrel with 2 poppers and 4 us poppers through a barrel and 2 targets in a box next to the barrel. Then back the other way through a corridor for 2 paper targets on the run. Then to the right around a wall to a port for 3 more paper and onto 2 more on the run to the end with 4 more paper. I guess if you pay the stats officer enough, you will win the stage. John the checks in the mail. Following and I do mean behind were Rod Maeda and Nolan Smyth. For Limited Rudolf Waldinger won with Wayne Leong and Randy Coates following close behind.

Stage 5 was a classifier set up by Wesley Lew. I had to come up with something that even Wes wouldn't screw up, but he did. After he had set up the stage someone noticed that from the last box, shooting the right target would impact the wall so everything had to be moved over 12 inches. Edison Lee walked away with top honors with Sheryl Cruz and Rod Maeda right behind him. For Limited John ( I'm getting tired of writing his name ) Daudet won with Gary Ashcavai and Wayne Leong coming next.

Open match winner was Rod Maeda, 1st master Nolar Smyth, 1st A Ray Wakida, 1st B Max Flora, and 1st C was Gillis Johnson. For Limited, match winner was Rudolf Waldinger, 1st A John Daudet, 1st B Wayne Leong, 1st C Randy Coates, and 1st D was Joanne Kritzer.

I want to thank all the before mentioned CRO's and John Daudet for do sign-ups, Randy Coates running to the copy machine so that we would have enough classifier sheets, and Steve Wong for having the classifier sheets there in the first place. ( even if there wasn't enough of them ) Without you guys there would be no match!

This clever stage looked fast and easy, but it took some thought to do it properly and accurately. Nolan Smyth won this stage. Stage Three "No More S" was from Louis Cambre aided by Erik Warren. It was a very good stage that required lots of work to dismantle the former structure from the Golden Gate. Steve Wong had his way in this stage. Stage Four "Home on the Range" was another good one from John Daudet aided by Ray Wakida. Steve Wong won this one also. I must say that all the stages were outstanding for real shooting and challenging practice.

Thanks again to the CRO's who did the job. Ray Wakida was the match winner--congratulations. He shot consistently clean and finished near the top of each stage. John Daudet was second just ahead of Rod Maeda at third.

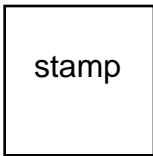
